

## Foreword

The bibliography is designed to be used in addition to the documents, *English Language Arts 10, 20, 30: A Bibliography*, dated September 1990 and *English 10, 20, 30: A Curriculum Guide for Division IV*, dated January 1975.

Please note the following changes from the previous bibliographies.

- The resource *Viewpoints*, edited by Christine McClymont, previously listed for level 10, 20, has now been authorized for level 10, 20, 30.
- *Twisted Tales from Shakespeare*, by Armour, was previously authorized for the comic mode in the level 30 B American course of study. It has been moved from the Non-Fiction category to the Essays category.
- The genre, Essays, has been expanded to include the following related short prose selections: feature article, editorial, autobiography, newspaper report, investigative article, and profile.

Schools are reminded that the book by Hansen and Taylor, *Rick Hansen: Man in Motion*, has been authorized for level 10, Adventure and Courage theme.

Anthologies listed in this bibliography, while of value because they contain a number of authorized selections, also include non-authorized works, some of which may provoke controversy. Wherever possible, this has been noted in the annotation.







The Act of Writing: Canadian Essays for Composition, 3rd ed. (Print-Composition-References). Ronald Conrad. McGraw-Hill Ryerson (MRH), 1990. 348 p. ISBN 0-07-549662-3 (\$20.95 pbk.) Instructor's Manual ISBN 0-07-549663-1 (\$5.00 pbk.)

Changes to the previously listed 1983 edition include the addition of a chapter devoted to argumentation and persuasion and the enlargement of the process in writing chapter. Authors include David Suzuki, Michele Landsberg, Mavor Moore, Russell Baker, and Margaret Laurence. Table of contents. Contents by subject. Glossary. Instructor's Manual also available.

Level 30B Canadian

The Blue Pools of Paradise (Print-Poems). Mick Burrs. Coteau Books (COT), 1983. 57 p. ISBN 0-919926-26-6 (\$6.00 pbk.)

Written by a Saskatchewan poet, this collection of lyric and narrative poetry is grouped thematically. Burrs explores memories of his Jewish roots in eastern Europe and Czarist Russia, the family's early years in the United States, and his adult years in Canada. He deals with family relationships, especially the lack of loving communication between the poet and his father. The collection provides a sensitive portrayal of the elderly.

Level 30B Canadian

Driving Miss Daisy (Print-Modern Plays). Alfred Uhry. Theatre Communications Group (FIR), 1988. 51 p. ISBN 0-930452-88-7 (hdc. \$23.95) ISBN 0-930452-89-5 (pbk. \$9.95)

This winner of the 1988 Pulitzer Prize is a sensitive, whimsical, and thought-provoking treatment of aging and racial prejudice. Daisy Werthan is an elderly Jewish matron coerced into hiring a Black chauffeur, Hoke Coleburn. Over the next 25 years, Daisy becomes increasingly dependent on Hoke's steady, good-humoured care. Daisy and Hoke establish deep mutual respect and affection.

Level 30B American, Romantic

I Walk in Two Worlds (Print-Non-Ficion). Eleanor Brass. Glenbow Museum (GLE), 1987. 80 p. ISBN 0-919224-67-9 (\$9.95 pbk.)

The author recounts the interesting and varied experiences of her early youth on the Peepeekisis Reserve, her harsh treatment at an Indian boarding school, encounters with prejudice from Indian agents, marriage, work at the YWCA, and her role in formation of the Indian friendship centre in Peace River. An appendix includes some of the articles written during the 1950s and 60s. Black and white photographs. Also suitable for grade 9.

**On Cue 2** (Print-Modern Plays). Diane F. Eaton. Harcourt Brace Jovanovich (HBJC), 1991. 348 p. BB 6321 (\$20.90 pbk.) Teacher's Guide BB 6322 (\$10.45 pbk.)

A collection of 12 Canadian, American, and British plays, each giving short introductory questions, biographic notes, and concluding response and extension questions. Includes stage plays, radio plays, and teleplays. Table of contents. Glossary.

Teacher's guide provides comments and charts of activities for each play, classroom strategies, and a bibliography.

A collection of 36 Canadian and American prose selections organized into the following seven thematic units: Learning to Learn, Values and Choices, Life and Spirit, Public Policy, Aging, Loving, and The Earth and Us. Each selection is supported by response and extension questions. Includes short stories, articles, essays, biographies, and editorials. Table of contents. Contents by theme. Contents by form. Rita Joe's poetry, organized by theme, is a reflection of her Micmac heritage and her quest for a just society. Her poems are gentle, straightforward, concise portraits of her people and their land.

A collection of 29 legends from the oral storytelling tradition of the Micmac peoples, featuring an introductory chapter designed to assist in understanding the complexity and richness of metaphor in Micmac legends. Table of contents. Sources and notes. Appendix of Micmac alphabet and orthography. Bibliography. Suggested as a teacher resource. Also suitable for grade 9.


An anthology of legends from the oral storytelling tradition of the Blackfeet. Percy Bullchild's stated purpose is to write the Indian version of his people's "own true ways" in history and legend. Includes stories about creation, Napi, Bloodclot (Kut-toe-yis), and honouring Creator Sun. Illustrations, as drawn by the author on cowhide, appear in black and white throughout the book. Preface. Write It on Your Heart (Print-Poems). Harry Robinson. Talonbooks/Theytus (UTP), 1989. 319 p. ISBN 0-88922-273-8 (\$18.95 pbk.)

Compiled and edited by Wendy Wickwire, this collection of oral retellings of the Interior Salish uses verse form in simple, spare colloquial style. Stories about the origin of the world, the time of the animal people, and pre- and post- contact life chronicle the treasure house of a vibrant culture and the changes resultant from interaction with European cultures. Robinson's stories, which reflect the original patterns of his first language, were gradually translated into his second language as more and more of his audience understood only English. Table of contents. This is suggested as a teacher resource.
